

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Innovating Learning, One School at a Time

Horace Mann, Henry H. Filer, Kinloch Park, Miami Springs, and Palm Springs middle schools are joining Verizon Innovative Learning Schools (VILs) for the 2024-2025 school year. These five schools join 15 other Miami-Dade public schools already in the program.
